Established in 1856, Maryvale has grown and transitioned into an indispensable source of assistance for children and families. On a daily basis, 72 abused or neglected children have found a home with us while nearly 300 children attend our Early Education Centers, and annually, we work with hundreds of struggling families in the community.

All Maryvale programs are guided by the principles of Trauma Informed Care -- a proactive treatment model that recognizes the impact of trauma on youth and offers interventions that address both trauma-related symptoms and their underlying causes. Trauma Informed Care helps us understand, engage and empower vulnerable children and youth in their recovery, including those who have been sexually exploited and/or are struggling with chemical dependency.
